



# Arts festival ready to celebrate its fifth year

Norwich Cathedral's Hostry is once again set to be the stage for an autumn festival celebrating Norfolk and the arts.

Hansells Hostry Festival is celebrating its fifth year this October with an eclectic programme of entertainment that also has a special anniversary focus on five key events.


"This year is a retrospective and a celebration of the last five years," said artistic director Stash Kirkbride.

"We are homing in on the five core projects that have helped make the festival such a success over the last five years, and these projects span across the creative landscape."

The five projects are: the festival's headline play, a production of Mahler's Conversion; a new performance piece by inclusive theatre company Total Ensemble; Chamber Orchestra Anglia performing Mendelssohn, Mozart and Korngold; the Paint Out Norwich art competition and the Norfolk Arts Awards.

Other events in the programme include soprano Lisa Cassidy as Lady Macbeth in a new opera about the Shakespearean character, and a night of jazz with vocalist Laura White.

Mr Kirkbride said: "People can look forward to a showcase of
